Grade 6 students have loved baking and serving parents at The Little Bean Cafe. The cafe operates every Friday morning before assembly. Here are some of the cafe's secret recipes for you to try at home...



LEMON AND COCONUT SLICE

Ingredients

Biscuit base

- 250g packet of gluten free plain arrowroot biscuits
- 1 ½ cups of desiccated coconut
- 1 tablespoon of lemon zest, approx. 1 large lemon
- ¾ cup of condensed milk
- 80g of melted butter
- 2 ½ tablespoons of freshly squeezed lemon juice, approx. 1 large lemon.

Lemon Icing

- 2 cups of pure icing sugar
- 60g of melted butter
- 2 tablespoons of freshly squeezed lemon juice

Method:

Biscuit base

- 1- Line a 9 x 9-inch square baking pan with baking paper or use a disposable foil baking pan.
- 2- In a food processor or with a rolling pin, crush up the biscuits to a crumb.
- 3- Pour crushed biscuits into a large mixing bowl.
- 4- Stir through desiccated coconut and lemon zest.
- 5- Pour in condensed milk, melted butter, and lemon juice. Mix until well combined.
- 6- Press mixture firmly into the lined pan using a spatula, wooden spoon, or your hands.
- 7- Place into the fridge to cool.

Lemon Icing

- 1-In a medium sized bowl, sift in icing sugar.
- 2- Pour in melted butter and lemon juice. Whisk until well combined and smooth.
- 3-Spread icing over biscuit base.
- 4-Refrigerate for at least 1 hour or until the icing has set.

MALTESER SLICE

Ingredients

- 125g of Butter
- 395g of sweetened condensed milk
- 2tbs of cocoa powder
- 250g of plain sweet biscuits
- 2 cups (60g) rice bubbles
- 280g of Maltesers
- 200g of white chocolate
- 2tbs of coconut oil



Method:

- 1- Line a 18cm x 28cm rectangular baking tray with baking paper.
- 2- Melt the butter, condensed milk, and cocoa in the microwave on 50% power until melted. Whisk until smooth.
- 3- Crush biscuits in a food processor.
- 4- Stir the crushed biscuits, rice bubbles and 1 cup of halved Maltesers (leave the rest for decorating the top of the slice) through the melted butter/sweetened condensed milk and cocoa mixture. Mix until combined.
- 5- Press firmly into tray.
- 6- Melt the white chocolate and coconut oil in the microwave in 30 second bursts (50% power), stirring each time until smooth. Pour over slice.
- 7- Press the remaining Maltesers into the chocolate.

ICE-CREAM IN A BAG

HOW TO MAKE ICE-CREAM IN A BAG BY ANYA DALTON

YOU NEED:

- 1 TABLESPOON OF SUGAR
- 1 CUP OF MILK
- 1 TEASPOON OF VANILLA ESSENCE
- 6 TABLESPOONS OF ROCK SALT
- 2 CUPS OF ICE
- 4 LITRE ZIP LOCK BAG
- 1 LITRE ZIP LOCK BAG

WHAT TO DO:

1. HALF FILL THE 4 LITRE ZIP LOCK BAG WITH ICE (ABOUT 2 CUPS).
2. ADD THE SALT AND SEAL THE BAG.
3. POUR THE SUGAR, MILK AND VANILLA ESSENCE INTO THE 1 LITRE ZIP LOCK BAG AND SEAL SECURELY.
4. OPEN THE LARGE ZIP LOCK BAG AND PLACE THE SMALLER BAG INSIDE. SEAL THE LARGE BAG.
5. SHAKE AND ROCK THE LARGE BAG FOR 10 TO 15 MINUTES. IT MAY HELP TO WEAR GLOVES OR WRAP A TEA TOWEL AROUND THE BAG TO PROTECT YOUR HANDS FROM THE COLD.
6. AFTER ENOUGH SHAKING, THE MIXTURE IN THE SMALL BAG WILL BECOME ICE CREAM AND IS READY TO EAT. ENJOY!

WHY IS IT SO?

WHEN SALT IS ADDED IT LOWERS THE FREEZING POINT OF THE ICE. THUS, IT TAKES MORE ENERGY TO BE ABSORBED FROM THE SURROUNDING ENVIRONMENT FOR THE ICE TO MELT. THIS EFFECTIVELY MAKES THE ICE COLDER THAN IT NORMALLY IS AND FREEZES THE ICE CREAM MIXTURE MORE EFFICIENTLY. LARGER CRYSTALS OF SALT, LIKE ROCK SALT OR ICE CREAM SALT, TAKE MORE TIME TO DISSOLVE IN THE WATER AROUND THE ICE AND ALLOWS FOR EVEN MORE COOLING OF THE ICE CREAM.

Grade 6

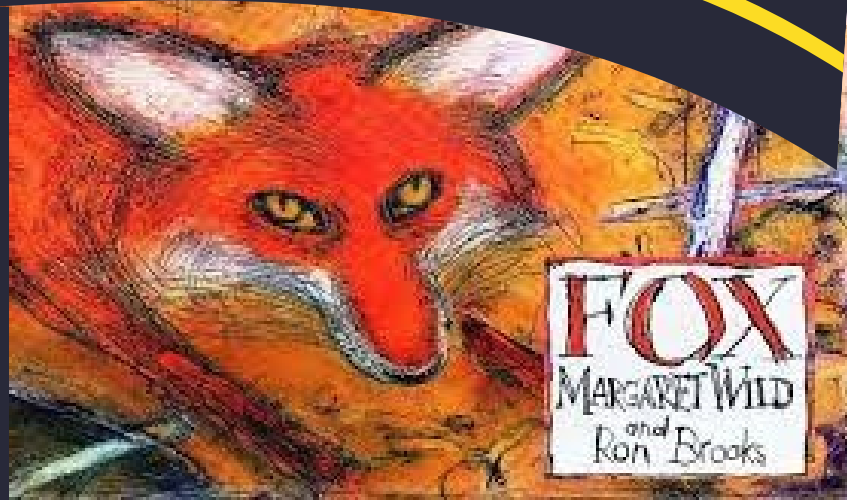

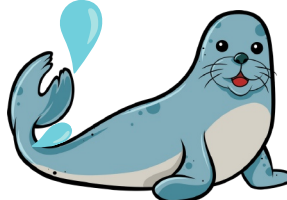


I SEA, I CARE
